Watch *'Washington's Armor, The Journey'* and then write a brief answer to each of the following questions based on the events in the movie.

1. Why was George sent to deliver a letter to the French?
2. Why was Gist concerned about the Indians?
3. Why did George risk his life to cross the frozen river?
4. How difficult do you think it was for George to cross the frozen land and river being hunted by Indians and the French?
5. Do you think George was scared during his journey?
6. Why do you think George would make a good leader to follow?

Answer Key:

1. The French had crossed the river into British territory and decided to claim the land as their own.
2. Although many Indians were formally allied with the British, Gist was concerned that many groups were being tempted to join the French and turn on the British soldiers and citizens in the area.
3. George crossed the river because he had to warn his commander of the French's intentions and that any delay would put him and other British citizens and soldiers into harms way.
4. This question has many plausible answers. George probably had a difficult time trudging through the freezing cold, unable to pause because of the Indians tracking him.
5. According to George's journals he was indeed scared during his journeys. However, George had tremendous trust that God was watching out for him and would protect him.
6. There are many qualities that made George a great leader. In this film we clearly see his determination, integrity, and honesty played out in his actions with others. He was also tremendously brave and willing to sacrifice himself if need be to warn the rest of his friends and people.
